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Art Review for *Singulart*

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How do you assess the artist's technique?

I find that you have incredible technical control.

The figures, the fabrics, the transitions appear very precise and at the same time vibrant. I like how you combine different textures and layers of color; it has depth and movement.

I find the way you work with color gradients particularly impressive; they create space and atmosphere without being overly explicit.

What is the strength of the portfolio?

For me, your paintings have an extraordinary emotional power.

Your art seems honest and inwardly guided, not conformist, and that is something very valuable.

For me, art is not decoration, but expression, attitude, and truth, and that is exactly what your works embody. I would encourage you to continue down this path without worrying about what might be better received or what galleries might expect.

Truly significant art arises from authenticity, depth, and conviction, and all of that is already clearly evident in your work.

Whom or what can you follow and study, or from whom or what can you draw inspiration?

I imagine you could draw inspiration from artists like Anselm Kiefer, Pina Bausch, or the composer Max Richter.

With Kiefer, I see parallels in the depth and weight of the themes, in the way history, memory, and emotion merge into a dense, almost material language.

Pina Bausch reminds me of her sensitivity to movement, the body, and inner states, this connection between vulnerability and strength.

And when I think of Max Richter, I think of the emotional intensity and tranquility that is also palpable in your paintings, this ability to simultaneously depict pain and beauty.

Where do you see the artist in the art market in terms of audience, pricing, and estimated market potential?

I think your work is clearly in the upper range in terms of quality and expression.
